- The season after winter.
- A spinning flow of air.
- Short for funnel cloud.
- An alert issued by the local National Weather Service office when a particular weather hazard is either imminent or has been reported.
- A disturbance of the atmosphere marked by wind and some kind of precipitation, or thunder and lightning.
- Precipitation in the form of ice.
- A natural movement of air at a velocity relative to the surface of the earth.
- A violent thunderstorm which can produce hail and large tornadoes and can maintain itself for several hours through updrafts and downdrafts.
- A rotating cloud column extending downward from a cloud base that is not in contact with the ground.
- A funnel cloud that can develop from a small shower or thunderstorm when the air aloft is cold.
- A means of classifying tornadoes according to the damage they cause.
- A small intense vortex within a tornado circulation.
- Winds that shift in a clockwise direction with time at a given location.
- A National Weather Service alert that indicates conditions are favorable for the occurrence of a particular weather hazard.
